

# The Fairford Community Centre makes history

On Saturday 14 June 2008 Mr Henry Elwes, the Lord Lieutenant of Gloucestershire officially declared the Fairford Community Centre open. This was the culmination of eight years of hard work by the Town Council and the Parochial Church Council and was funded by many donations from the people of Fairford, the Heritage Lottery Fund, the Ernest Cook Trust, the Rural Renaissance, the Mercers Company and many other charitable bodies.

Not only do the Town Council, St Mary's, the Volunteer Bureau and Gloucestershire Youth Services have sparkling new offices but Fairford now has a number of meeting rooms furnished to modern standards which can be hired on very reasonable terms.

The Lottery Fund stipulated in its requirements for a grant that a proper home should be found for Fairford's heritage which should be

accessible to as many people as possible. As a result the Fairford History Society now has an Archive Room and a Heritage Room in the new Centre. The Archive Room houses artefacts, books and photographs that have been collected during the four-year life of the Society and also is a home for the much larger collection which is recorded digitally on computers together with the CD's of our Oral History collection.

The Heritage Room is designed to act as a visitor centre for the very large number of tourists who come each year to view the stained glass in St Mary's Church and the historic centre of Fairford. Around the walls of the room is a timeline that records key dates and events in the history of Fairford and relates these to national events. There is also a display case housing a changing exhibition of historical objects but pride of place is given to a lectern designed and made by Ian Westlake which has a loose leaf collection of information sheets relating to some of the more interesting events in Fairford's history. 21st Century technology is also in



evidence with a 42" plasma screen television and DVD player to show audio-visual presentations about the St Mary's windows and other topics.

The History Society looks forward to using all these exciting new facilities in its quest to make the heritage of Fairford available to as wide a range of people as possible. **John Read**
